

# LEADERSHIP & ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGE CONCENTRATION

## **OVERVIEW**

The Leadership and Organizational Change concentration allows students to explore and develop critical managerial and entrepreneurial skills in decision making, conflict management, communication, and venture-creation skills. The concentration provides students not only with technical skills but also with the ability to manage people and resources effectively. All Management majors are required to complete at least one concentration; the Leadership & Organizational Change concentration is one of nine current options.

## **CAREER PATH**

Students who complete their Bachelor's degree with a concentration in Leadership and Organizational Change are positioned well for entry-level managerial positions in the financial, biotechnology, high tech, non-profit, computer and telecommunications industries, as well as in education, insurance, and healthcare. Recent graduates of the program work as account executives, human resource managers, consultants, recruiters, and retail managers, and several have started their own firms .
